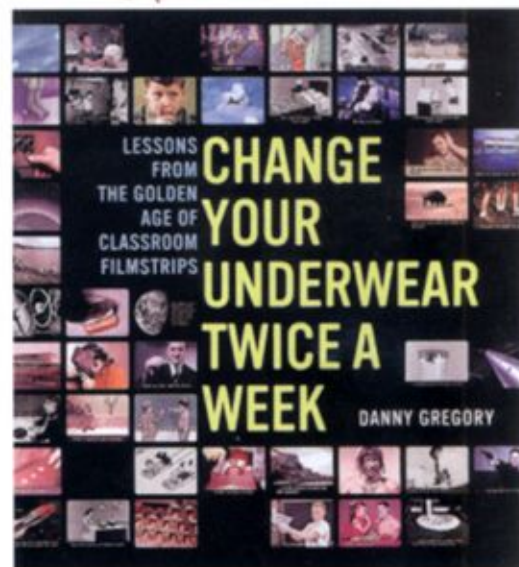


1. Dorothy Valworth Convertible Handbag

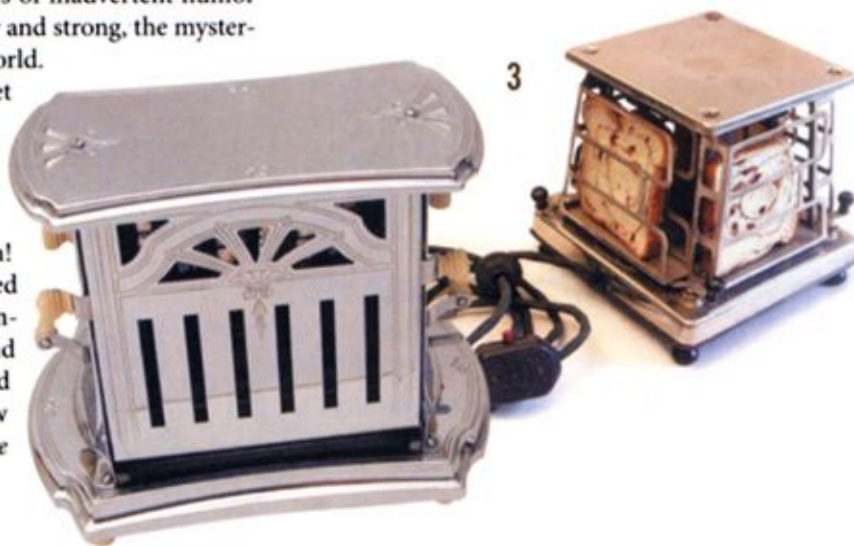
2. Change Your Underwear Twice A Week
